Where the electricity supply cable has to pass through a fire place, stone surround etc. ensure suitable rubber bushes are fitted at possible wear points.

If installed in an open fireplace, blank off the chimney to reduce the risk of a back draught which can cause the safety cut-out to operate.

Keep the power cord away from hot surfaces and hot conditions. Do not route the power lead in front of the appliance.

If the electricity supply cable is damaged do not use the appliance until it has been replaced. For safety reasons the replacement has to be carried out by a service agent or a similarly competent electrician.

To ensure that the paint is properly cured, it is recommended that you burn your electric fireplace for at least four (4) hours the first time with the heater on. During the first fire, the unit will release an odour caused by the curing of the paint and the burning off of oils remaining from manufacturing. Smoke detectors may go off at this time. Open windows to ventilate the room for a couple of hours.

CAUTION: In order to avoid a hazard due to inadvertent resetting of the thermal cut-out, this appliance must not be supplied through an external switching device, such as a timer, or connected to a circuit that is regularly switched on and off by the utility.

Do not operate the appliance if it is damaged.

Repairs of electrical appliances must only be performed by an electrical engineer. Should the appliance fail to operate, or in case of any damage, please contact the retailer from whom the appliance was purchased.



OPERATING THE APPLIANCE

Press 6 to Turn the Appliance On/Off.



NOTE: To use both remote and manual functions the manual on/off switch must be in 'ON' position.
To prevent the product overheating, there is a 10s delay when turning on and off the heater fan.

The manual button controls basic functions.
Use the remote hand set to carry out all functions.

Press 3 to Turn Flames and Fuel bed ON/Off at the same time.

Press 4 to select the colour of flame or return to the OFF position. There are three flame colour options.


Press 5 to select the colour of fuel bed or return to the OFF position.

There are fourteen fuel bed colour options.

Note: The appliance will lose the memory for the light functions when the switch is set to the Off Position or the remote runs out of power.

REMOTE CONTROL

The remote control should be left on a flat surface in the room where the appliance is installed and away from any direct flow of hot air.





Ensure the clock is set to the correct time.

Press M for 3 seconds.

Press the $\ensuremath{^{\backprime}}$ or $\ensuremath{^{\backprime}}$ button to choose setting.

The selected character will be highlighted.

Press the '+' or '-' button to adjust the number.





The minute increment / decrement by 15min per press.



Hold the \buildrel button for 3 seconds or wait for 10 seconds to save and exit the heating time period setting.

To turn heating off, return to Normal Control Mode.

When in Daily Timer Mode switching the appliance off with the remote will stop the light output. The heat output will continue according to the timer settings.

ADJUSTING THE SET TEMPERATURE

Press the '+' or '-' button to increase or decrease the temperature on the basis of COMF temperature.

COMF means the actual temperature is the same as setting.

ECO means the actual temperature is 2°C lower than the setting temperature.

ECO- means 4°C lower.

COMF+ means 2°C higher.

COMF++ means 4°C higher.



Press button.

There are 3 flame colour options.

There are 5 levels of brightness, including off.



Press the ' \leftarrow ' or ' \rightarrow ' button to cycle through the flame colour options.

Press the '+' button to increase the flame brightness.


Press the '-' button to decrease the flame brightness until off.

FUEL BED COLOUR ADJUSTMENT

Press 'to enter the fuel bed light adjustment screen.

There are 14 fuel bed colour options.

There are 5 levels of brightness, including off.



Press the ' \leftarrow ' or ' \rightarrow ' button to cycle through the fuel bed colour options.

Press the '+' button to increase the fuel bed brightness.

Press the '-' button to decrease the fuel bed brightness until off.


MOOD LIGHTING COLOUR ADJUSTMENT

Optional. Must be purchased separetely. See manual for details.

Press on to enter the Mood light adjustment screen.

There are 14 colour options.

There are 6 levels of brightness, including off.



Press the $\fine ' \leftarrow '$ or $\fine ' \rightarrow '$ button to cycle through the colour options.


Press the '+' button to increase the brightness.

Press the '-' button to decrease the brightness until off.

NORMAL CONTROL MODE


Normal Control Mode is the default setting.

Press M button until the N logo is shown



Press the '+' or '-' button to adjust the setting temperature from 17 °C to 25°C.

Press \\\ A button to turn the heat on/off.



Note: It is normal for the fan heater to stop running for periods of time. This happens if the room temperature is higher than the temperature set on the control.

The heater indicator will be turned off after 10s if the flame is switched ON. The heater indicator will stay ON if only the heating function is used.

When in Normal Control Mode switching the appliance off with the remote will stop both the light and heat output.

COUNT DOWN TIMER

This setting is only in normal heating control mode. It allows the appliance to be returned to Standby after a set period of time. The heater must be switched on to use this function.

Press **O** to cycle through the setting from Off and 0.5 hours to 9 hours. Timer logo and remaining time will show on the screen.

The heater of appliance can be automatically run by using daily timer and weekly timer.

WEEK TIMER HEATING

The following heating periods have been preset, these can be altered if desired:

From Monday to Friday 06:00 until 08:30 17:00 until 22:00

From Saturday to Sunday 06:30 until 09:30 11:00 until 13:00 17:00 until 22:00



Press M until W shows.



Press $'\leftarrow'$ or $'\rightarrow'$ to move the cursor (a flashing underline).

Press the \buildrel button in the corresponding week position to select (the character is highlighted) or cancel (the character is displayed normally) the current setting, the same time period can be selected together.

MOIDWOIDE Sa Su 07:00 - - 09:30 18:15 - - 22:00 00:00 - - 00:00

Press the \rightarrow button to move the cursor to the time period setting area.

Press $'\leftarrow'$ or $'\rightarrow'$ button to choose hour or minute.

Press '+' or '-' to set the number.

A maximum of 3 timed heating periods can be set per day. Minute increment / decrement by 15min per press.

Press $\buildrel \buildrel$ to set the heating time for the selected day and return to the week line.

Hold the → button for 3 seconds or wait for 10 seconds to save and exit the heating time period setting.

Press \checkmark ' \leftarrow ' or ' \rightarrow ' to check the timer setting for the week timer heating mode.

To turn heating off, return to Normal Control Mode.

When in Weekly Timer Mode switching the appliance off with the remote will stop the light output. The heat output will continue according to the timer settings.

ADJUSTING THE SET TEMPERATURE

Press the `+' or `-' button to increase or decrease the temperature on the basis of COMF temperature.

COMF means the actual temperature is the same as setting.

ECO means the actual temperature is 2°C lower than the setting temperature.

ECO- means 4°C lower.

COMF+ means 2°C higher.

COMF++ means 4°C higher.

ADAPTIVE START CONTROL

The heater will automatically determine the appropriate time to heat to ensure that it will reach the set-pointed temperature at the set time (up to 45 minutes prior to the set time).

ADVANCE MODE

The heating state can be advanced to the next period under both the daily and week timer heating mode.




If the heater is on in the current period, pressing the button will turn the heater off.

If the heater is off in the current period, pressing the button will turn the heater on.

Heating output depends on the room temperature and setting temperature.

Press \int A to enter the Advance mode under the daily and week timer heating mode.



Press $\$ A again or timer period ends will exit the Advance mode.

WINDOW OPEN DETECTING

When the transmitter detects a rapid drop in room temperature, it will be judged as an open window: the warning icon will be displayed and the heating will be turned off automatically.



After indoor temperature rise or manual intervention (by operating remote control), it will return to normal working state.

QUICK SET UP GUIDE (DAY OF WEEK/TIME/CHANGE TEMPERATURE FROM C/F OR F/C)

Press the power button to turn on the remote.

Press and hold the M (Mode) button for 3 seconds. The first option that BOLDS is the day of the week.

To change the day of the week, press the + or - key, then press the right arrow key to go to the hour.

To change hour, press the + or - key, then press the right arrow key to go to the minute.

To change the minute, press the + or - key, then press the right arrow key to go to the room temperature.

To change or calibrate the room temperature, press the + or - key, then press the right arrow key to go the Temperature Scale between $^{\circ}\text{C}$ and $^{\circ}\text{F}$.

To change the Temperature Scale, press the + or - key.

To complete, either press the power button or the bottom right back arrow button to save.

BATTERY

The battery power level is indicated at the top right of the remote control screen.

Battery Full	No action required
Battery Half Power	Ensure new batteries are available.
Battery Empty	Replace batteries immediately





NOTE: The remote control has a Battery Status indicator (top right corner), after an extended period of displaying empty the LED screen will cease to function despite the handset still being able to send commands.




BATTERY REPLACEMENT

Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the appliance and safely disposed of.









Ensure that the handset batteries are new and inserted correctly.

Dispose of old batteries at an appropriate recycling facility.

Battery replacement is recommended after 1 year. The Remote requires two 1.5V alkaline AAA batteries.

Ensure the correct polarity.

Do not short circuit the terminals.

Do not attempt to recharge non-rechargeable batteries.

Remove rechargeable batteries before charging.

Do not mix old and new batteries.

Remove batteries if the appliance is not used for long periods.

Changing the batteries will not affect the Timer Mode settings.

Ensure the clock is set to the correct time.



NOTE: To use both remote and manual functions the manual on/off switch must be in 'ON' position. In order to prevent the product becoming too hot, there is 10s delay when turning on the heater and a 10s delay when turning off the heater fan.

The manual button controls basic functions, not a full range of controls. Use the remote hand set to carry out all functions.

HEATER RUNNING INDICATORS

When the fan heater is used in conjunction with the flame or fuel bed effects the heater running indicators will light up for 10 seconds.

The LEDs will illuminate for 10 seconds if the flame or fuel bed effect is On.

If the fan heater is used independently, the heater running indicators will stay on.

RESET BUTTON FOR REMOTE CONTROL

If the handset loses signal or needs to be replaced then, see Servicing Instructions for details.

SIGNAL CODE

The handheld transmitter is configured in the factory with a unique signal code.

IMPORTANT: If the handset loses signal or needs to be replaced, see Servicing Section for details.



MAINTENANCE

ENSURE THE APPLIANCE IS TURNED OFF BEFORE CLEANING.


Wait for at least 10 minutes until the appliance has cooled down.


GLASS CLEANING

Wipe the glass viewing panel with a damp cloth and buff with a lint free duster.

Caution: Do not use abrasive cleaners on the glass panel. Do not spray liquids directly onto any surface of the unit.

CLEANING THE FUEL EFFECT





Remove and wash the fuel effect to remove any dust particles. Alternatively clean with a lint free duster.


Ensure that the effect is dry before replacing.

Replace the fuel effect see Installation Instructions Section 5 for layout.

Replace in reverse order.

CLEANING AIR INLETS

Clean the air inlet and outlet grilles regularly with a soft cloth or the nozzle of a vacuum cleaner.



Dust build-up can inhibit efficient performance of the fan and lead to the safety cut-out operating.

Keep the area around the appliance clean and free of fluff, dust or pet hair.

In particular, build-up of dust etc. can occur around the heater area. Take particular care to keep this area free from such particles on a regular basis to prevent build-up.

SERVICING AND SUPPORT

To keep your appliance looking and performing at its best, it must be serviced annually. This service must be undertaken by a suitably qualified individual and your retailer can organize this for you.



FITTING THE APPLIANCE

LOCATING THE STUDIO

Your new Studio may be installed virtually anywhere in your home. However, when choosing a location ensure that the general instructions are followed.

For best results, install out of direct sunlight.

The heater should ideally be fitted into/onto an internal flat wall constructed from either wood studs & drywall, brick. The fixings provided are for use on brick walls ONLY. Please ensure that suitable fixings are used when securing to any hollow or purpose built cavity.

NOTE: This appliance is not suitable for fitting to a Cavity Wall, backing on to an outside wall, an open chimney or any opening that may be subject to damp and draft, unless adequate precautions are taken to avoid the appliance coming into contact with moisture or excessive drafts. In such installations, any existing chimney and/or purpose provided air vents should be fully sealed.

For exterior/outside walls, insulate the enclosure to the same degree as the rest of the house, apply vapor barrier and drywall, as per local installation codes. Do not insulate the appliance itself.

Make sure there are no pipes or cables behind the area to be drilled or cut.

Always ensure the appliance is adequately supported and sits on a firm structure when mounting above floor level.

The appliance should ideally be located close to a suitable main socket to enable connection. An extension could be run from an existing socket outlet but this must be carried out by a suitably qualified electrical engineer.

Remote Handset Battery Replacement

Replace the batteries to restore display.

Maintenance of Motors

The motor used on the flame effect is pre-lubricated for extended bearing life and requires no further lubrication. However, periodic cleaning/vacuuming of the heater unit is recommended.

Resetting the Thermal Cutout Switch

The appliance is fitted with an Electronic Safety Control (E.S.). This is a safety device which switches off the fire if, the appliance overheats for any reason e.g. when covered.

If the heater stops operating while the flame effect continues normally, this indicates that the E.S. Control is in operation.

The E.S. Control can only be re-set after the appliance has cooled down.

To re-set the E.S:

Switch off the appliance (Manual On/Off switch) and leave for approximately 120 minutes.

Remove any obstruction to the fan heater outlet or other internal parts.

Switch on appliance and the E.S. Control will re-set. Ensure that the appliance is functioning correctly. If the E.S. Control operates again, the appliance should be checked by a competent Electrician.

Any part(s) found to be defective during the warranty period as outlined above will be repaired or replaced at FPI's option through an accredited distributor, dealer or pre-approved and assigned agent provided that the defective part is returned to the distributor, dealer or agent for inspection if requested by FPI. Alternatively, FPI may, at its own discretion, fully discharge all of its obligations under warranty by refunding the verified purchase price of the product to the original purchaser. The purchase price must be confirmed by the original Bill of Sale.

IMPORTANT: A 15 amp, 60Hz 120 Volt circuit is required for installation of this Appliance. A dedicated circuit is not required, but is highly recommended to prevent circuit breaker from tripping or fuse failure. Failure to provide adequate power to this Appliance will void your warranty.



NOTE: If hard wiring to the Appliance, this must be completed by a qualified electrician. Failure to do so will void your warranty.

The authorized selling dealer, or an alternative authorized FPI dealer if pre-approved by FPI, is responsible for all in-field diagnosis and service work related to all warranty claims. FPI is not responsible for results or costs of workmanship of unauthorized FPI dealers or agents in the negligence of their service work.

At all times, FPI reserves the right to inspect reported in the field/on location complaints of products claimed to be defective before processing or authorizing any claim. Failure to allow this upon request will void the warranty.

All warranty claims must be submitted by the dealer servicing the claim, including a copy of the Bill of Sale (proof of purchase by you). All claims must be complete and provide full details as requested by FPI to receive consideration for evaluation. **Incomplete claims may be rejected.**

Replacement Appliances to the original purchaser are limited to one per warranty term.

The Appliance must be installed according to all manufacturers' instructions as per the manual.

All Local and National required codes must be met.

The installer is responsible for ensuring the Appliance is operating as designed at the time of installation.

The original purchaser is responsible for the annual maintenance of the Appliance, as outlined in the owner's manual. As outlined below, the warranty may be voided due to problems caused by a lack of maintenance.

Purchased parts: Repair/replacement parts purchased by the consumer from FPI after the original coverage has expired on the Appliance will carry a **90-day** warranty from the purchase date, valid with a receipt only. Any item shown to be defective will be repaired or replaced at our discretion. No labor coverage is included with these parts.

If freight damage has been found either externally or internally, the dealer must be informed within 3 days. All claims as a result of damage must be submitted by the dealer servicing the claim, including a copy of the Bill of Sale (proof of purchase). All claims must be complete and provide full details as requested by FPI to receive consideration for evaluation. **Incomplete claims may be rejected.**

As this is a 1-year Limited Warranty, if the Appliance needs to be replaced, the Appliance that was purchased at the time of sale might not be replaced with exactly the same model Appliance. In that case, FPI will replace your Appliance with one that is similar at the time of replacement under the terms of this Limited Lifetime Warranty, but ONLY in the event that an item covered by the Limited Lifetime Warranty is found to be defective. Please refer to the table on first page of this warranty for items covered by the Limited Lifetime Warranty. Product changes might be the result of the original Appliance being discontinued, changes in regulatory requirements, product advancements, etc., which are beyond the control of FPI. This Limited Lifetime Warranty does not cover any installation costs, or costs associated with changes of required clearances for the replacement Appliance, hearth pads, mantles, facing and/or facing materials such as framing, completed walls made of drywall, wood, non- combustible board, tile, brick, stone, marble etc., venting/chimney systems, or components of the chimney system.

If a suitable replacement is not available, FPI will refund 50% of the purchase price of the Appliance and any applicable FPI accessories (faceplates, brick panels, media, etc.) purchased at the time of sale. In no event will FPI refund any portion of the purchase price of, or reimburse costs associated with, any other items, including without limitation, installation of a new unit, changes of required clearances for a new unit, hearth pads, mantles, facing and/or facing materials such as framing, completed walls made of drywall, wood, non-combustible board, tile, brick, stone, marble etc., venting/chimney systems, or components of the chimney system. A copy of the receipt or bill of sale will be necessary to validate the purchase price.
